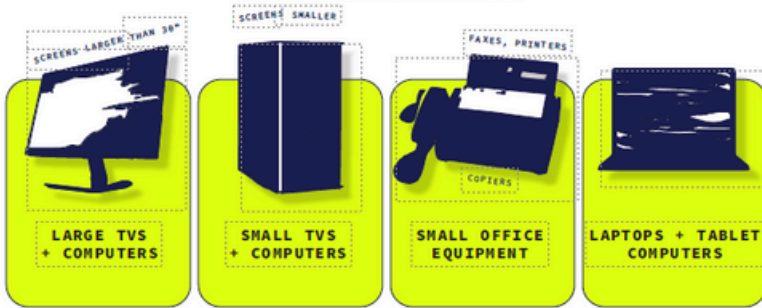


The 5/6 Girls Floor Hockey Team took home the gold medal at their tournament held at Riverview School on March 21-22, 2025.

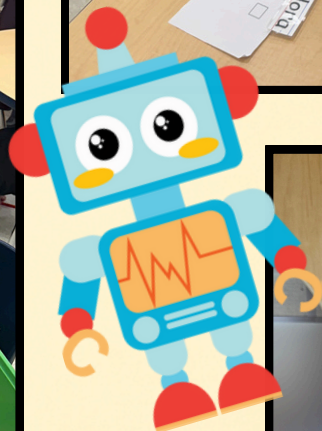

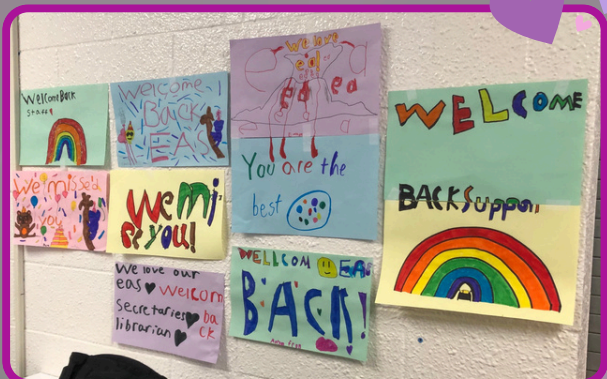

Staying Involved In School



Children greatly benefit when parents take an active role in what goes on in school. However, many parents find it difficult to get involved in their child's education. Some believe they will be bothering teachers; yet, most teachers welcome the added information and insight that parents provide. Some believe that teachers are the experts and that parent opinions are not useful; yet, usually parents have information that makes teaching easier. Some parents are uncomfortable meeting with teachers; yet, most teachers welcome the opportunity to work with parents and go out of their way to make the experience rewarding. Here are some ways to become involved in your child's education and help them succeed in school.

Know your child's teacher.

The simplest way to become involved is to attend school functions designed to introduce you to teachers and demonstrate what your child is learning. Scheduling convenient conferences between you and your child's teacher also helps in learning about daily activities and expectations. Write down questions and topics before meeting with your child's teacher and be sure to ask your child if there is anything he/she wants you to discuss with his/her teacher. Over the course of the school year, try to stay in touch with your child's teacher(s). Brief notes or phone calls on special occasions can help to make the school year more positive.

Take part in school activities.

Ask your child's teacher how you can be involved in school activities. Many parents enjoy doing volunteer work in their child's school and most schools enthusiastically welcome assistance from parents. Help is needed in the school library, cafeteria, on field trips, or in after-school programs. Others take part in fundraising events. Let your child's teacher know you are interested in helping at school. Make a list for the school of your special talents or specific areas in which you believe you can be the most helpful.

Make your home a learning place.

Help your child make the most of afterschool time. Set aside a work time for the whole family to use to accomplish quiet activities (eg., independent reading, studying, completing homework). Set aside some space in your home for a study center where everything needed for successful completion of homework can be found. Review your child's homework assignments before they are returned to school. Try to view the work as a process, not just as a finished product. Have a variety of reading material around your house. Also, ask teachers for books appropriate reading levels and read them together. Also, ask for some books on improving study habits.

By getting to know your child's teachers, participating in school activities, and making your home a learning place, you can be a partner in your child's education and help him/her approach school with a more positive attitude.
